We are noticing an increase in the number of children using websites such as TikTok and Instagram. Both of these sites are not recommended for primary age school children for many reasons including their own safety and their social and emotional health. Unfortunately there have been many incidents recently of children creating videos and images that are unkind to others. We are also aware of times where unknown adults are contacting children through these sites too. This causes upset for children at home and then this continues into school. If you think your child uses social media such as TikTok and Instagram it may be worth checking their accounts with them and talking to them about how they use it and if they have had any problems when using it.
