Year 1

Our favourite part of the week was getting the large apparatus out in the hall! We pretended to be animals and moved in different ways under, on and around the equipment. In literacy we have written instructions for cucumber sandwiches for the Queen's tea party. Our maths work has focussed on the number 11 and how we can make it in different Ways using coins. Our new Rekenreks arrived so we have used them to help us.



Year 2

In Year 2 we have been learning about non-chronological reports in Literacy. We have been writing reports about imaginary animals called Tonga Lizards. In Maths we have been learning about the value of coins and notes. We have used our knowledge of place value to begin to add up amounts of coins. In PSHE we have been learning about medicines. We discussed rules to help Jigsaw Jo stay safe with medicines. We have also been Historians this week, looking at objects from the past and discussing what they tell us about the past.

Year 3

The best part of this week was meeting some beautiful birds of prey. We learnt lots of interesting facts about a Harris Hawk and a Barn Owl named Owl-bert (!) For our writing we completed some shape poetry on different predators and learnt what onomatopoeia is. In maths we have started learning about fractions, beginning with halves and Quarters. We have also enjoyed gymnastics in PE.



Year 4

In Year 4 this week we have been reading Treasure Island. In writing, we have created character descriptions for a pirate and practised using inverted commas, ready for writing a narrative next week. In maths, we have looked at hundredths and tenths on a hundreds squares and tenths as a decimal. In DT, we designed our own ocean clean up device. In RE, we have explored how Christians celebrate The Last Supper and Maundy Thursday.

Year 5

In year 5, we have moved our learning onto decimal numbers in maths. The children of Year 5 have been recognising and performing basic maths skills using decimal numbers. In writing, we have been revisiting our sentence writing skills to be able to write a narrative piece of text relating to 'The Alchemist's Letter'. In RE, we have spoken and represented through sketchnoting 'Why do Christians celebrate Communion?'. In Design and Technology, we have begun to design our own Tudor purse. Well done Year 5!

Year 6

In Year 6 we have finished Romeo and Juliet and the students have written excellent diary entries. We welcomed a talk on Monday all about healthy bodies and avoiding drugs to remain healthy. In Science, we are learning about nutrition and what we need to eat as part of a balanced diet. In Maths, we have finished our unit perimeter, area and volume and we have enjoyed created cuboids and cutting out parallelograms. In Computing, we have formatted spreadsheets and used functions to quickly add, multiply and find averages. In RE, we have spoken, written and drawn answers to the question of why the death of Jesus is important to Christians.
