




HONORING THE PAST INSPIRING THE FUTURE

Nicola Virginia Adams OBE (born 1982) is a British former professional boxer who competed from 2017 to 2019. She retired with an undefeated record and held the WBO female flyweight title in 2019.



Gladys Mae West (born 1930) is an American mathematician known for her contributions to the mathematical modelling of the shape of the Earth.



Malorie Blackman OBE (born 1962) is a British writer who held the position of Children's Laureate from 2013 to 2015. In doing so, she became the first Black Children's Laureate.



Phyllis Akua Opoku-Gyimah, also known as Lady Phyll (born 1974) is a British political activist known for her work for racial, gender and LGBT+ equality. Sharon Michele White, Lady Chote, DBE (born 1967) is a British businesswoman. She is currently Chair of the John Lewis Partnership, having previously held a variety of roles in the Civil Service.





Trevor Beresford Romeo OBE better known as Jazzie B (born 1963) is a British DJ and music producer. He is the founder of Soul II Soul.





Alex Pascall OBE (born 1936) born on the island of Grenada in the Eastern Caribbean, travelled to Britain as a 22-year-old in1959, is a British broadcaster, journalist, political campaigner, musician, composer, oral historian and educator.
