Important Vocabulary learned:

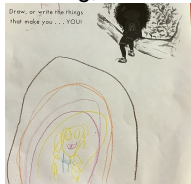
Understanding different feelings words

Year 1

This week Year 1 have been looking at the class rules they came up with at the beginning of the school year. We have been discussing what our classroom would look like if everyone was following the classroom rules. We have discussed what good learning looks like and have drawn pictures to show this.

Important Vocabulary learned:

Calm, happy, sad, behaviour, supported, consequences.

Year 2

In Year 2 our topic is Being Me. We have been learning about how our behaviour in and out of the classroom can impact in different ways. The children have been learning that they have a right to learn and how behaviour can help or disrupt this. In the classroom we have been identifying good choices and poor choices for behaviour. We can say which consequences are fair for appropriate and inappropriate behaviour.

Important Vocabulary learned: Choices, rights, consequences, responsibilities, rewards

Year 3

Year 3 have been learning about relationships and how their actions can affect others. We have also been discussing respect and consideration for others and consequences for our behaviour.

Important Vocabulary learned:

Behaviour, rewards, consequences, actions, feelings rights, responsibilities, fairness, choices

Year 4

During this week's PSHE lesson, we explored the importance of making 'choices', linking it to the UN Convention on Rights of the Child. Both classes maturely discussed how not having the right to an education would make them feel. We spoke about valuing others opinions, even if they differ from our own. Both classes then wrote a speech about a topic that is important to them, which they performed to the rest of the class.

Important Vocabulary learned:

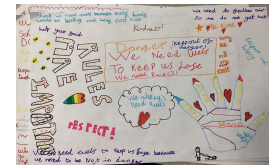
Decisions, choices, democracy, UN Convention on Rights of the Child, Learning Charter.

Year 5

During this week's PSHE learning, the children of year 5 have explored their rights and responsibilities within their own communities and being at school.

Both classes showed great understanding of this and highlighted that they have 'the right to feel safe and protected in school' and their responsibility would be to 'keep their hands and feet to themselves and to respect each other'.

Important Vocabulary learned: Rights, Wealth, Poverty, Responsibilities, Prejudice, Citizen, Privilege, Deprive.



Year 6

In PSHE lessons this week the children have been identifying a goal they want to achieve by the end of the year. After looking at what barriers there might be to achieving these, they discussed how they could overcome them by making the right choices. This led to a discussion about everyone having the right to learn and achieve their goals.

We also explored their rights and responsibilities within their own communities and being at school.

Important Vocabulary learned: goals, barriers, choices, rights, responsibilities, consequences, rewards
