Voice 21: Catalysing Oracy, a National Priority

The introduction of the Voice 21 scheme marks a revolution in developing oracy—the strategic priority for our school and the UK government. Oracy, defined as effective speaking and listening, is critical for academic success and future employment. Voice 21 offers a structured, whole-school approach, embedding talk into every subject. It uses the Oracy Framework to explicitly teach skills across four strands: linguistic, physical, cognitive, and social/emotional.

This program moves talk from an expectation to an explicitly taught skill, closing the language gap and empowering every child with the confidence to articulate their ideas and succeed in school and life.

Mrs Hawkridge added her thoughts: "Voice 21 is a reputable platform within many primary and secondary schools and we are extremely excited about the three year commitment that our school has made towards developing teachers' knowledge around effective oracy strategies."

Miss Robinson and Mrs Hancock are our 'Oracy Champions' and piloting Voice 21 in their own classrooms before imparting their wisdom upon the rest of the school after Christmas.

"Oracy is a school priority, and a national priority. Voice 21 will help develop higher level thinking, particular children with lots of curiosity who ask lots of questions. It's especially important for children who struggle with communication and language." - Mrs Peel
